Slovenia

One of Europe's Best Kept Secrets!

TAKE A LITTLE BIT OF BAVARIA, a sliver of the Mediterranean Riviera, a stretch of the Danube, a touch of Venice and a slice of the Balkans—and you have Slovenia, one of Europe's best-kept secrets. This charming little country, which declared independence from Yugoslavia in 1991,

true. Piran is a beautiful little town on the coast where you'll find some great restaurants serving fresh seafood and the perfect place for a little stroll through its picturesque narrow streets. The impressive grottoes at the Postojna caves make up one of the largest cave systems in the world – 15 miles long and are filled with impressive rock formations, halls, stalagmites and stalactites.

Although the country may not be as large as Austria, Italy or Greece, it is certainly less crowded. With a culture that is both modern and traditional and with the country as part of the European Union, a trip to Slovenia is worth your while, especially since it's both easy and pleasurable to travel around the country.

Galapagos Islands

Home of Amazing Wildlife

PENGUINS AND DOLPHINS, SEA LIONS AND IGUANAS, tropical birds and giant tortoises—this unique collection of species comes together in a single destination on the equator—the Galapagos Islands. There aren't many places in the world where you can swim alongside a family of sea lions and experience such an array of different species. The Galapagos Islands' remoteness from other landmasses, 600 miles off the coast of Ecuador and the absence of human settlements until the past century allowed their animal inhabitants to live with little fear of predators. As a result, the islands have an abundance of animals, birds and reptiles that make it a paradise for nature lovers.

The Galapagos Islands are best known as the home of giant tortoises that can weigh as much as 600 lb and live 150 years. But you'll also see marine iguanas (they resemble small dragons and are the only seagoing lizards in the world), scarlet-breasted frigate birds; blue-footed, red-footed, masked and Nazca boobies; tiny penguins at home in the tropics; and giant, graceful albatrosses. About half of the species are endemic to the islands, found nowhere else on Earth.



Volcanic in origin, the archipelago has 13 large (and scores of lesser) islands whose terrain is mostly stark and barren, consisting primarily of a lava rock- and cacti-filled landscape hosted by an arid climate. However, the highlands of the larger islands are dominated by cloud forests, with lush vegetation and cooler temperatures.

These days, most visitors see the islands as part of a cruise tour. Small boats drop travelers off on individual islands, where knowledgeable naturalists introduce the lifestyles and mating rituals of the native species. Two of our favorite vessels are the M/V Evolution which carries 32 guests in comfort and offers world class service, and the Celebrity Xpedition, slightly bigger and more luxurious. Both offer an unforgettable



experience of these amazing islands.

If you prefer a land based experience we recommend the Finch Bay Eco Resort from where you can take daily yacht excursions which will expose you to a variety of unique islands and curious wildlife.

Swimming and snorkeling are possible at most sites, often accompanied by curious sea lions, sea turtles, an occasional penguin and scores of tropical fish. The marine environment of the Galapagos is also a protected area; it is the largest marine reserve in the Western Hemisphere, and the second largest in the world after the Great Barrier Reef.

As most itineraries to the Galapagos Islands begin in either Ecuador or Peru, we highly recommend combining them with a visit to Quito or an unforgettable journey to Machu Picchu.

Swakopmund along the coast is Namibia's playground. And while there's plenty to do within city limits, the real action happens in the desert surrounding Swakopmund. Quad-biking, sandboarding, sand-skiing, and parasailing. The south coast is fringed by tropical islands, with barely a beach hut in sight. Visitors can play Robinson Crusoe at Ko Samui or Gili Trawangan. Inland from the coast lie the Cardamom Mountains, part of a vast tropical wilderness that provides a home to elusive wildlife and is the gateway to emerging ecotourism adventures. The islands of Koh Koun, Koh Rung Samloem, Koh Tang, Koh Domlong, just to name a few, are surrounded by clear emerald green water. These rain forested islands set in the azure tropical waters off the Bay of Sihanouk Ville have also some of the best beaches in the world; pristine white sand and not over-crowded.

The mighty Mekong River cuts through the country and is home to some of the region's last remaining freshwater dolphins. The northeast is a world unto itself, its wild and mountainous landscapes a home for Cambodia's ethnic minorities and an abundance of natural attractions, including thundering waterfalls and crater lakes. A river cruise on the Mekong is one of our favorite ways to see the country! (Viking, Avalon, and Pandaw have excellent itineraries.)

Now, what about the food? The quality of food is better when you are not feeding 4000 people. This allows the kitchen to put out more gourmet menus sensitive to the areas you are traveling to. River cruises are not about eating large quantities of food 12 times a day – it's about having a refined experience. I'm not



saying they skimp on food – on the contrary, but I rather have creative exciting meals than tons of lesser quality food. In addition the ratio of staff to guests is much better, often 3 to 1!

Truly river cruising is a totally unique experience. If you want an immersive cultural experience you can really get that here without having to pack and unpack each time you go from town to town. Considering Europe has an amazing river system you can see a good part of it right from your boat. But Europe is not the only place with rivers – consider Vietnam, Myanmar and even Russia and China! There are even smaller luxury river cruise lines that you can find on the Amazon and in France for example in Burgundy on an exquisite barge cruise.
